Monthly Prize Draw

Each month a prize draw is held for all current members of the club. A third of the subscription money is distributed as prizes.

The top monthly prize is £1000.

The remainder of the prize fund is distributed as many differently valued prizes.

The draw takes place in Bridge Street pavilion on the second Friday of every month at 4:30 pm. All members are welcome to attend. Results are displayed on the ORC notice board in the village.

Facilities managed

Bridge Street

A comprehensive recreation area used for football, cricket and tennis. The athletics club, art group, exercise classes and many more use the pavilion.

Town Meadow

Located at the end of the High Street, this is a picturesque nine-hole golf course. The scout and guide movements also use the pavilion.

Overton School

A floodlit training ground for Overton Youth FC and Overton Harriers AC.

Berrydown Football Ground

The original home of Overton United FC, it is now home to Overton Youth FC

Berrydown Extension

Land to the east of the existing football ground is now being managed by the ORC. The ground is being prepared for further football pitches and a cricket ground. New changing facilities are planned.

Frequently asked questions

Berrydown was Overton's original football ground. In 1966 the ORC was conceived and the subscription was set at 10p per week. The Bridge Street ground was leased from Portals (now De La Rue) and developed to accommodate a higher standard of soccer. If you wander past Bridge Street in the summer, in a beautiful setting opposite the church, you will find Overton's cricket club has its home there and tennis players are hardy enough to play there for most of the year. In its time it has offered the opportunity to practise netball and archery and the Harriers also use it as their base.

A local benefactor, Colonel Hoare, gave Town Meadow in 1972. Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council are now the owners and it is leased back to the ORC. It provided a rugby pitch until the rugby club outgrew these premises, at which time the golf course was extended down to the river.

. In 2003 the Borough Council, at the ORC's request, purchased additional land at Berrydown for sports pitches and a pavilion.

In addition to income from the membership scheme, affiliated clubs pay a subsidised hire charge. Non-affiliated groups may hire ORC facilities, but pay higher fees. Grants have been sought for major projects such as the new facilities planned for Berrydown.

The ORC are particularly interested in promoting sport to young people and will occasionally run special sessions, in addition to normal club activities. These have included summer sports taster sessions and youth cricket. There is also a Young Sports Person of the Year award.

What is the ORC?

It is a registered charity formed in 1965 to provide for the sport and recreational needs of Overton and the surrounding area.

A committee manages the facilities voluntarily. Membership subscriptions are collected either by clubs or by local volunteers who also hand out the draw prizes.
